A space of the ,second generation'

- an own space of the ,second generation
- faced with norm of univocal natio-ethnocultural belongingess
- experiencing multiple natio-ethno-cultural belongingness
- and thus othering and discrimination
- on the *Indernet* the norm
- other norms not challenged

Functions

- of the own space:
 - refuge
 - exchange among ,equals'
 - acceptance of belongingness
 - positive identification
 - information
 - helps to deal with experiences in ,Germany'

Relevance for internet studies

- focus on localisation
- need to contextualise
- interdependency of function and form
- coexisting functions
